-Paragraph 1: introduces your topic and explains why you find this person inspirational/interesting.

Paragraph 2: has the details about your person's life that you found in research. (childhood/early life, education or training, career or accomplishments)

Paragraph 3: This will be the conclusion and states how the detail you found support why you found the person inspirational or interesting and discussed how you would describe him/her based on his/her life.

Focus on Assigned Topic	The entire text is related to the assigned topic and allows the reader to understand much more about the topic.	Most of the text is related to the assigned topic. The story wanders off at one point, but the reader can still learn something about the topic.	Some of the text is related to the assigned topic, but a reader does not learn much about the topic. Organization	The biography is very well organized. One idea or scene follows another in a logical sequence with clear transitions.	The biography is pretty well organized.
